

Chain enough so that without stretching it is about 6" long - the last chain will be the start of the next row. Do 2 more chain. Turn  
Now treble across to the other end. (You'll thread ribbon through this). Chain 1. Turn.

Now double crochet across to the other end. Chain 1. Turn. Repeat this row until it measures about 6" doing 2 chain on the last row.

Treble across to end (another ribbon row).

Slip stitch across first 6 or 7 stitches. Chain 1 then double crochet until you are within 6 or 7 stitches of the end of the row. Chain 1. Turn.

Now double crochet across to the other end. Chain 1. Turn. Repeat this row until it measures about 8".

I now fold the top together to make a hood and double crochet across. But you could cast off and sew up the top.

I put a stitch or 2 in the back of the ribbon so that when it is washed the ribbons don't all come out in the dryer!

An easy item to make as it is just a small rectangle on top of a square. Also the sizing doesn't have to be exact - all sizes are unfortunately needed.
